

TOOL TO ASSIST TUTORSHIP COUNCILS IN CONSULTING THE CURATEUR PUBLIC ON PROTECTIVE SUPERVISION

The tutorship council is responsible for overseeing the activities of the tutor or curator. In addition to ensuring that the tutor or curator is soundly managing the property of the person under their protection, you must ensure that they respect the person's rights, arrange for the person's needs to be met, promote the maintenance and development of the protected person's capacities, and consult and inform the person about decisions they make on his or her behalf.

For assistance with this task, don't hesitate to refer to the guide that comes with this tool or speak with a practitioner from the health and social services network (e.g., a social worker), legal advisor, the users committee of the care facility in which the person lives, or an advocacy group.

If the situation that concerns you is not resolved despite your efforts to find a solution, you can count on the Curateur public for support and assistance. Curateur public staff will work with you to ensure that the tutor or curator properly fulfills his or her role and obligations.

The tutorship council can contact the Curateur public at any time to discuss situations or issues of concern, and, if necessary, determine what steps to take.

Instructions: Answer the questions below if, as the tutorship council, you have concerns regarding the protection of the person, their welfare, or the respect of their rights. When you have finished, send it to the Curateur public.

1. In the overview of protective supervision given to you by the tutor or curator, what are the elements that concern you?

2. What interventions have you made or do you intend to make with the tutor or curator to clarify these concerns?

3. Do you have any other comments concerning the protection of the person?
